The Governor did that both to help with funding his office and to make certain that advice that might relate to a future campaign would be paid by the campaign.

Mason became Senior Political Advisor in 2015 at the beginning of the Governor's second term. TIMELINE

January 6, 2016 -

Governor Bentley met with ALEA Secretary Spencer Collier, Investigators Scott Lee, and Jack Wilson late in the afternoon. Governor Bentley had received a threatening correspondence on or around December 28, and was reporting it to Collier, Lee and Wilson. Collier indicated to Governor Bentley he viewed the email as a threat of extortion and indicated to Governor Bentley he was going to investigate the matter. Collier made it clear in the presence of Wilson and Lee that it was Collier who was ordering the investigation, not Governor Bentley.

Before leaving the meeting, Collier reported to the Governor he had been contacted by Baron Coleman who wanted to have a discussion with him. Collier told Governor Bentley Coleman wanted to report "some things Matt Hart had done". Collier indicated to Governor Bentley he believed Coleman was frightened.

Following that meeting, Governor Bentley met with reporters Kim Chandler and Chuck Dean, David Byrne, Jennifer Ardis and two attorneys by phone to discuss a Lawsuit the Administration was filing against the federal Government regarding the Refugee Resettlement Act. A Press Conference announcing the suit was scheduled for the following day.

Later that evening Governor Bentley contacted Rebekah Mason. During that phone conversation Governor Bentley discussed with Mason the meeting he had with the media that afternoon, as well as the Collier meeting regarding the threatening email. Governor Bentley told Mason he was going to share some confidential information with her. Governor Bentley recounted the conversation he had with Collier regarding the Coleman request. Governor Bentley asked Mason not to share that information with anyone. Mason agreed. Governor Bentley told Mason Collier told him Coleman was scared and that's why he wanted to talk with Spencer and make a report.

February 2, 2016 -

Media reported that Baron Coleman had filed an affidavit claiming he had received secret Grand Jury testimony in the upcoming Lee County trial from Prosecutor Matt Hart.

February 8, 2016 -

At approximately 930am Rebekah Mason met briefly with Governor Bentley. Mason asked Governor Bentley how his meeting was with Collier and Byrne. Governor Bentley recounted the conversation with Mason. Mason strongly advised the Governor to steer clear of any outside involvement in the Lee County trial, lest it distract from the Governor's policy agenda he was launched only a week prior.

February 11, 2016 -

Media reported that Matt Hart had filed a series of affidavits in the Lee County case. One of those affidavits was signed by Spencer Collier, ALEA Secretary. Recalling the conversation earlier in the week, Mason contacted Governor Bentley upon reading the news reports. Mason told Governor Bentley about the report, and that one affidavit was from Collier. Mason asked Governor Bentley if he had heard from Collier since their meeting three days earlier. Governor Bentley said "No". Mason asked if David Byrne had discussed the affidavit with Governor Bentley since the meeting three days earlier. Governor Bentley said "No". Governor Bentley told Mason he was going to call Collier and ask him about the news report.

Later that evening, Governor Bentley called Mason. Governor Bentley told Mason he had spoken to Collier and asked about the affidavit Hart filed signed by Collier. Governor Bentley told Mason, Collier told him that he had reported to Hart that he couldn't sign the original affidavit as Hart had requested. Then Collier told Governor Bentley, that Hart said he would subpoena Collier if he didn't produce an affidavit. Collier told Governor Bentley that Hart told him a Grand Jury was open at 8am the next morning, and he would bring Collier before the Grand Jury for sworn testimony. Governor Bentley recounted to Mason that Spencer was scared. Governor Bentley told Mason that Collier told him, he wrote a second affidavit to appease Hart. Collier told Governor Bentley the second affidavit was "benign" and didn't really say anything of significance.

February 12, 2016 -

Governor Bentley called Spencer Collier to his office. In a meeting Governor Bentley once again asked Collier why he gave an affidavit to Hart, when he had indicated on February 8 that he had not investigated the matter Hart was referring to. Collier once again told Governor Bentley that he was told by Hart that if he did not hand over an affidavit, Hart would bring Collier before a Grand Jury. Governor Bentley specifically asked Spencer if he felt like that was a threat from Hart. Collier answered "Yes".

February 13, 2016 -

Spencer Collier contacted Governor Bentley at 4:57pm. Collier had been contacted by media. Collier asked Governor Bentley if he wanted Collier to respond. Governor Bentley said "No."

February 16, 2016 -

Governor Bentley contacted Mason on or around 9 am. Governor Bentley indicated to Mason that he had a conversation with or about Collier. Governor Bentley told Mason that Collier had "changed his mind" and was now saying he did NOT feel like he was threatened regarding the affidavit request by Matt Hart. Governor Bentley told Mason he was concerned and troubled by the inconsistency in Collier. Governor Bentley told Mason he was going to call everyone in to his office that day and "get to the bottom of this."

Those in attendance left the room, except for Mason and Governor Bentley.

Collier told Governor Bentley he had something he needed to share. Collier told Governor Bentley and Mason that he had recently had a conversation with Matt Hart. Collier told the Governor that Hart thought he was a good man, whose heart was in the right place. Collier said Hart told him that Governor Bentley was good he believed, but there were people working with the Governor who had committed felonies. Collier looked at Mason and said, "And Rebekah I believe he was talking about you." Collier said he told Hart that he had done background checks on employees and would know if someone had a prior conviction. Collier said Hart told him these were people who had not yet been convicted. Again, Spencer told Mason "I believe he was talking about you, Rebekah." Mason did not respond.

Governor Bentley asked Collier to explain what he meant. Collier told Governor Bentley he wasn't sure what Hart meant by the statement, but he and his wife Melissa had discussed it and prayed about it the night before and decided Collier needed to tell Governor Bentley and Mason what Hart had said.

Mason asked Collier when Hart made that comment. Collier told Mason the comment was made at 5pm the previous day.

Governor Bentley once again reminded Collier that he had told Collier not to file the affidavit because as Collier had indicated, there had been no investigation. At that time, Collier became restless and fidgety. Collier told Governor Bentley he was afraid of Hart. Collier told Governor Bentley he did not want to get a subpoena. He told Governor Bentley he did not want to testify. Governor Bentley reminded Collier that he had said to the Governor that he felt threatened by Hart.

Collier once again said he did not want to testify, and he told Governor Bentley "You don't want to testify either." Governor Bentley reminded Collier that he would likely be called himself to testify in the upcoming Lee County trial. Collier acted surprised and said, "I forgot about that. That's right. I hadn't thought about that."

Collier then told Governor Bentley "you would be doing this state a service if you got rid of Matt Hart." He told Governor Bentley Hart was a problem and it would be a huge help if Governor Bentley could do something about him.

Collier then told Governor Bentley that Hart had questioned Hal Taylor until midnight the previous day. Collier said he was afraid Hart was going to indict Hal.

Governor Bentley asked Spencer to bring the group back in the office for the meeting.

February 17, 2016 -

Governor Bentley called Collier to his office the morning of February 17. Governor Bentley told Collier he knew he had back surgery scheduled, and he knew he wasn't feeling well.

Governor Bentley told Collier he was going to place him on medical leave for three months for two reasons. 1. He wanted Collier to have his surgery and get well. And 2. He wanted Collier to get off his pain medicine.

Collier was once again apologetic to Governor Bentley and asked if he should resign. Governor Bentley said "No, I want you to come back in three months and get well. "

Governor Bentley told Collier he was placing Stan Stabler as Acting ALEA Secretary, Collier told Governor Bentley he thought that was a great idea. Later than day Collier introduced Stabler to ALEA Personnel as the Acting Secretary.

Collier had a letter in hand for Governor Bentley. He told Governor Bentley he wanted to reassign Hal Taylor to his previous position. Collier asked Governor Bentley if he wanted Collier or Stabler to do it. Governor Bentley told Collier to do it, since it was under his watch.

The two parted ways amicably. In the following weeks, Governor Bentley contacted Collier to check on his recovery from surgery. During one of those conversations Collier asked Governor Bentley if he was going to fire him, and was he going to lose his insurance. Governor Bentley told Collier he wanted him to get well and return to work.

On or around the week of February 22, Stan Stabler came to Governor Bentley's Office and indicated that he had been approached by ALEA personnel and employees regarding concerns about misuse of funds and state resources by Collier. Stabler told Governor Bentley he had reassigned two merit employees and terminated two appointees. Governor Bentley told Stabler to operate the department as he saw fit.

Stabler told Governor Bentley he was reassembling the ALEA Integrity Unit, which had been disassembled under Collier, to begin an internal review of ALEA.

The Integrity Unit concluded its report on or around March 18.

ALEA Released a statement to media indicating an Internal review of ALEA had been completed and had found items of concern including possible misuse of funds. Mason and Ardis met with ALEA PIO Anna Morris to draft the statement from ALEA.

March 22, 2016 -

Collier was terminated from his position as ALEA Secretary. Stabler was appointed to the position.

That evening, Al.com columnist John Archibald released a transcript of a recorded phone call between Governor Bentley and an unidentified person. Archibald identified that person as Mason.

March 23, 2016 -

Collier called a press conference in which he described in detail the tape recorded conversation. Collier gave multiple false accounts of events and conversations that had taken place within the last month. Collier inexplicably extoled the praises of Matt Hart at the press conference. Collier made numerous unfounded allegations against Governor Bentley and Mason in the press conference. Many of those allegations are recounted in the lawsuit filed April 19, 2016.





Budget Crisis Action Plan April/ May

1.Budget Crisis Tours

Continue targeted tours and speaking engagements at various counties. Governor continues to make personal visits to counties.

Priority Emphasis: "Real people" personally affected by potential budget cuts (State Park worker, Trooper, family who's loved one may lose vital benefits etc.)

Goal: To place Governor in a comfortable setting where he can personally hear from and talk with the actual people whose lives will be significantly impacted by the cuts forced by the Legislature's Clouse/ Orr Budget. Putting a face with the budget cuts makes it personal and relatable to Alabamians and decision-makers.

Secondary Emphasis would be personal appearances to Chamber groups, community and business leaders.

Legislators would continue to be invited to the speaking engagements/events in their respective districts.

Staff: Zach, Jennifer, Press Team, Legislative Team

2. Budget Crisis Cabinet Press Conferences

Cabinet Heads will hold individual press conferences highlighting and expressing concern about the potential cuts to their respective agencies.

Priority Emphasis: Those agencies that effects the greatest number of Alabamians, families, children and quality of life (DHR, DMH, etc.)

Goal: To add more voices of credibility and support to that of the Governor and to emphasize the stark reality of the effects of the Clouse Orr Budget.

3. Regular Conference Calls with Local Elected Officials

Similar to natural disaster response, Governor holds a series of conference calls with local elected leaders such as city council members and county commissioners. Also invited to join the conference calls may be Legislators. Governor holds informative

calls with a few select counties at a time, focusing on the potential cuts that are specific to the counties. Governor conducts these calls in the same manner he would any disaster briefing. In this case, he explains the Budget Crisis situation, his solution and the detrimental effects of the Clouse Orr Budget to their specific counties. 

Spencer:

I'll not resort to besmirching your character for truth telling as you've seen fit to do to me. And, I will always want to be the first to apologize for any misunderstanding that I may ever have in a communication. (And, as you will recall, I did not raise the oil change question though I had a passel of similar questions which I could have raised but did not want to do so in a public setting.)

But so you know, I had talked to a senior LFO staffer (who was present at the hearings) before the interview yesterday (initiated by reporter) to verify your comments were as I heard them. My recollections were confirmed.

Subsequent to your e-mail, I questioned today Rep. Collins, Rep. K. Johnson, Rep. Shedd who were all in attendance at the time the exchange occurred. Their individual recollections all comport with what I heard. I also asked a Chief of Staff Philip Bryan as to his recollection. Confirmed as the same. I have also queried today a staffer with the Governor's office who was in attendance—confirmed—same understanding.

That leads me to believe that you perhaps did not articulate what you thought you were saying. Each one of the above individuals unanimously agrees with what they (and I) heard. Further, when pressed about the lack of action on changing the oil change policy, your response was to say you could not terminate those working in the vehicle maintenance department because of the ALEA enabling legislation. The truth is that we have tremendous financial challenges in our state and, as you so rightly and perfectly indicated, there is a culture change that needs to occur within ALEA. I think you would agree this culture change needs to occur all across state government. But, the lack of dollars will not allow us to slowly change this culture. It must be quick and expeditious.

You've got a difficult job and a large agency to run that has been thrown together. I understand that. I thank you for your service to our state and encourage you to present whatever legislative solutions might be necessary or possible to help you run your agency in the best manner possible. MADISON COUNTY, Ala. (WHNT) — Budget hearings brought a number of state agencies before Alabama lawmakers as they made their case for more money from the general fund.

Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA) secretary Spencer Collier went before the committee requesting more than \$20 million for the next fiscal year.

"It came up in those hearings that our state troopers were driving from north Alabama, Dothan, or Mobile to Montgomery just to get an oil change in one of their trooper vehicles," said Senator Arthur Orr.

It was news to Orr, and a clear sign of inefficiency in the middle of a budget crisis.

Collier explained it had long been the regular practice for quite some time.

"This was for *oil changes*," stressed Senator Orr. "That's what infuriated quite frankly, a lot of legislators."

"They're not hired to be driving cars back and forth to be worked on, their primary purpose is public safety," said Representative Mike Ball.

Years as a state trooper makes Rep. Ball all too familiar with road tripping for regular maintenance, he calls it wasteful.

"It would show you saved money on your vehicle costs, what it doesn't factor is the cost of taking that trooper off the road," said Rep. Ball.

Collier told lawmakers he continued to use the same people because he didn't want to fire longtime mechanics in Montgomery, but that wasn't satisfactory for Sen. Orr, the outgoing chair of the general fund committee.

"Wouldn't you reassign that person and give them something else to do? Perhaps a lateral shift to the Department of Corrections or some other state agency that might need someone, a mechanic type job?" Collier said the consolidation of law enforcement agencies under ALEA has proven to be efficient. But a problem with the consolidation, he said, is it protects jobs that are no longer needed.

As a result, Collier says, ALEA is waiting for people to leave or retire. The Montgomery mechanics are a prime example of an occupation the agency no longer needs but is waiting to be phased out.

"To see this culture of doing things the same old way we've always done them was befuddling and quite frankly frustrating for many legislators," said Sen. Orr.

In an article from our news partner Al.com, Collier told lawmakers it is 'not happening anymore' but in an interview with WHNT News 19, Senator Orr says Collier is waiting to phase out those Montgomery mechanics.

Lawmakers return to Montgomery for the 2016 legislative session on February 2.
